From the Pastor

Confirmation

As Catholics, we believe that the seven Sacraments make present for us the life and ministry of Jesus as recorded in Sacred Scripture. In the Gospels of Matthew, Mark and Luke, following the Baptism of Jesus in the Jordan River, the Holy Spirit descends upon Him in the form of a dove, and His identity is confirmed by God the Father: "You are my beloved Son; with You I am well pleased!"

Then, on the evening of His Resurrection, Saint John in his Gospel (20:22) tells us that Jesus encounters the Apostles and breathes on them saying, "Receive the Holy Spirit..."

In Acts (2:1-4) we read about the first Pentecost and how the Holy Spirit is once again poured out in abundance on the Apostles to be shared, through them, with the whole world.

On Saturday, October 29th we will welcome to our parish a successor of the Apostles, Bishop Mark Eckman who is coming to confer the Sacrament of Confirmation upon 37 of our young men and women.

Through Confirmation, the biblical passages cited above will be "made present" for each of them; and they will become more like Christ, receiving the gifts of the Holy Spirit that will strengthen them to fight against evil and expand their hearts to serve those in need, in the name of Jesus.

Our congratulations and prayers go out to all of the candidates celebrating the Sacrament next Saturday, May 4th!

Parish News

40 Hours Devotion

Forty Hours' Devotion is a special exposition of the Blessed Sacrament over a period of three days, during which prayer continues uninterrupted for an approximate total of 40 hours. The devotion begins with a solemn Mass and Eucharistic Procession, and ends with Benediction and a solemn closing liturgy.

Often a visiting priest celebrates the Masses and gives the homilies and meditations. It is a time to be alone in prayer with Jesus but also for the community to come together for liturgical prayer.

The number 40 and period of three days is a remembrance of the 40 hours from Jesus' burial until His resurrection, but also a remembrance of the 40-day fast of Jesus in the desert. Probably the first inspiration for this devotion came from the Middle Ages, when the Blessed Sacrament was transferred to the repository tabernacle, referred to as "the Easter Sepulcher," during the Triduum.

The Forty Hours is extended Eucharistic Adoration, as the Blessed Sacrament remains exposed for a longer period of time.





Parish Presentation: ***Catholic and Jesuit Higher Education in the United States: Mission, History, and Identity***



Please join us on Tuesday, May 14 at 7:15 pm in Harkins Hall for a fascinating journey through the history of Catholic higher education in the United States with Michael T. Rizzi, Ed.D.

Dr. Rizzi is a 2003 graduate of the Georgetown University Edmund A. Walsh School of Foreign Service and received a Doctor of Education (Ed.D.) in higher education from the University of Pittsburgh in 2017. His recent book pictured here will be the topic of his presentation and will be available for purchase that evening.

He traces the complex history of colleges and universities Jesuits have operated in since 1798 in the United States, examining the history of the American education system through the eyes of institutions such as Georgetown University, Boston College, Fordham, Gonzaga, Marquette, and others. He is the first to tell the story of Jesuit Colleges collectively; a history of our higher education system and Jesuit colleges operating within it. He will explain that "what we consider a normal college experience today is very different from what higher education was in the past.

Sacramental Information



Baptisms are celebrated on Sundays after the 10:00 AM Mass at Saint Anne church. Call the parish office at (412) 531-5964 to schedule. Completion of a Pre-Baptism class is required with your

first child before scheduling. Our next Baptism class will be held on **May 7 at 5:30 PM** in the DePalma Room. If you have questions, or would like to register, contact Don Fontana at dfontana@stpaulofthecross.com.

Confessions: At Saint Anne you may receive the sacrament on Tuesdays from 5:15 - 6:15 PM and Saturdays from 11:00 - 11:45 AM. You can visit Saint Winifred church where reconciliation is scheduled on Saturdays from 4:45 - 5:15 PM.

Holy Eucharist is usually celebrated for the first time around age seven or eight and is preceded by First Confession (the Sacrament of Reconciliation). If you have a child who is of age, and currently enrolled in a program please save these important dates:

- May 2, Mandatory First Holy Communion Practice, at 6:00 PM in St. Anne church
- May 5, First Holy Communion at Noon in St Anne

Confirmation will take place for those students who have completed their 8th grade catechesis. Time spent in catechesis and prayer is necessary for preparing for such a pivotal sacrament in the life of our teens. If you have a child who is of age, and currently enrolled in a Faith Formation (CCD) program, please save these important dates:

- May 2, Mandatory Confirmation Practice at 7:00 PM in St. Anne church
- May 4, Confirmation at 10:00 AM in St Anne church

For adults, Confirmation usually takes place as part of the Order of Christian Initiation for Adults (OCIA) and interested candidates should connect with the Parish Office to inquire.

Weddings are scheduled on Saturdays at 1:30 PM in Saint Anne church. Arrangements must be made with the parish priest at least six months in advance, and a Pre-Cana class is required. This class takes place each year on the first weekend of March. Information about the class, as well as guidelines regarding wedding planning in our parish, is available on our website in the *Sacraments and Ceremonies* section.

Christian Rite of Burial

Funerals are *usually* scheduled Monday-Saturday at Saint Anne Church at 9:30 AM and most often coordinated by a funeral home director. Our sacristans will guide you through the planning of the Mass. In extraordinary circumstances, arrangements for a Blessing Service can alternately be made. All Catholics must make appropriate arrangements to be permanently interred in a cemetery or a Catholic funeral cannot be offered.

May is for Mary

May is normally part of the Easter season, the period of fifty days which lasts from Easter to Pentecost. During this time we celebrate the Lord's Resurrection from the dead, a celebration which culminates with his Ascension to the Father and the sending of the Holy Spirit to the Church on Pentecost. It is a fitting time to dedicate to the Blessed Virgin Mary, to recall her intense joy over her Son's Resurrection and the comfort and guidance she gave to the Apostles during this difficult period.

During the Easter season, Mary's presence in the beginnings of the Church is emphasized. She was present in the first community of disciples. In Acts 1:14, she was present with the Apostles in the Upper Room as they prayerfully waited for the descent of the Holy Spirit with hopeful expectation. As Pope St. John Paul II stated in *Redemptoris Mater*, "Mary was in the Upper Room, where the Apostles were preparing to take up this mission with the coming of the Spirit of Truth: she was present with them. In their midst Mary was "devoted to prayer" as the "mother of Jesus" (cf. Acts 1:13-14), of the Crucified and Risen Christ." Pope Benedict XVI vividly described Mary's maternal presence among the disciples after Jesus' Resurrection. He stated:

In the days that followed the Lord's resurrection, the Apostles stayed together, comforted by Mary's presence, and after the ascension, they persevered with her in prayerful expectation of Pentecost. Our Lady was a mother and teacher to them, a role that she continues to play for Christians of all times...

The Easter season is a fitting time to recall Mary's immense joy over her Son's Resurrection and to rediscover her role as mother and teacher in our lives. Mary has a unique role in the God's plan of salvation and in the Church. She consented to the coming of the Savior and cooperated in developing His mission. She brought Him into the world, raised Him and lovingly stood by His side during the years of His hidden life. She supported Him during His public ministry in a quiet way, beginning at Cana, where, by her intercession, Jesus performed His first miracle (John 2:1-12). She cooperated in His work, even uniting her own suffering with that of her Son, standing at the foot of His cross. Mary was Jesus' first disciple, humbly following Him during every step of His journey and mission. She trusted in God completely and lived by His grace. She is our model of true discipleship and of complete faith. During the Easter season we are more aware of Mary's motherly presence and love. It is perhaps for this reason that popular tradition has dedicated the month of May, which falls during this liturgical season, to Our Blessed Mother.

The Blessed Virgin Mary offered the disciples her prayers, motherly care, and witness. She continues to offer us her motherly love and intercession. During this month of May, let us rediscover her maternal role in each of our lives. Let us offer our spiritual mother our sincere prayers, that just as she aided the first Apostles with her prayers, she may also guide and intercede for us in our journey of faith.
