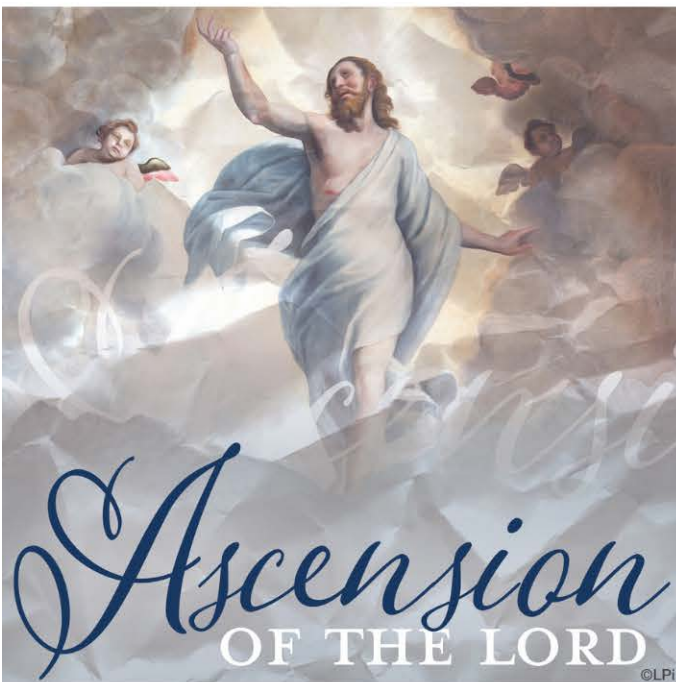


First Holy Communion

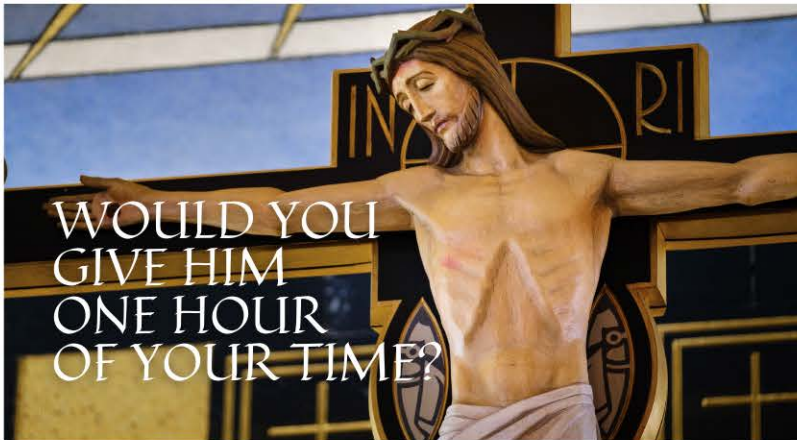

Honoring Mary in the Month of May



In the Catholic Church we set aside May as a special month to honor the Blessed Mother, for in her we find the greatest model of Christian faith and a loyal intercessor who always presents our needs, hopes and desires to her son, Jesus. Therefore, throughout this month we are called upon to publicly manifest our devotion to Mary. This can be accomplished in a variety of ways: by praying a family Rosary each day during the month, setting up a May altar in the home, lighting a votive candle before an image or statue of Mary, or simply reflecting upon the beautiful model of faith with which she provides us.

The Rosary is a centuries-old devotion intended to help us reflect and meditate on the life of Jesus, His mother Mary, and the earliest days of the Christian community. The mysteries of the Rosary tell the story of God's tremendous action in sending us His only Son to be our Redeemer and point us to the most significant events in the life of Christ. All twenty mysteries of the Rosary are derived from the Bible.

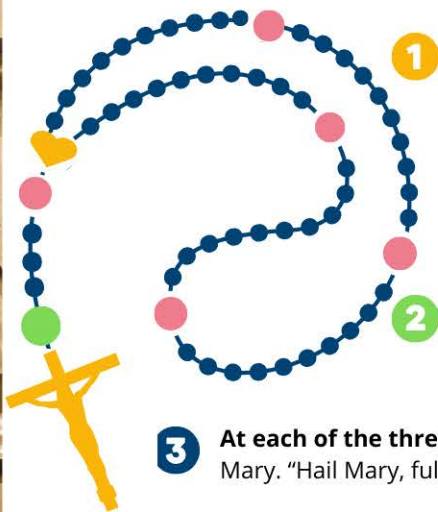

1 **At the crucifix** make the Sign of the Cross. Pray the Apostle's Creed, a summary of what we believe. "I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth . . ."

2 **At the first large bead** pray an Our Father, the prayer that Jesus taught us. "Our Father, who are in heaven . . ."

3 **At each of the three smaller beads** pray the Hail Mary. "Hail Mary, full of grace, the Lord is with you . . ."

4 **At the next large bead** pray the Doxology (the Glory Be). "Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit . . ."

5 **At the medal** say the first mystery and pray an Our Father.

6 **At the group of ten beads that follows** pray one Hail Mary for each bead.

7 **At the second large bead** pray the Glory Be, announce the next mystery, and pray an Our Father. Pray a Hail Mary for each of the beads in the next decade. **Repeat** this simple pattern for each of the remaining decades.

Conclude by making the Sign of the Cross.

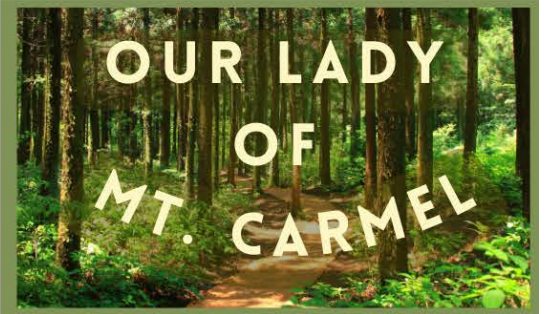

Third Grade Nature Study Class and Tulips!

Last fall, Mrs. Winschel's third grade Nature Study students, with the assistance of Mr. Unger, planted 900 red and white tulip bulbs. The tulips bloomed beautifully, but unfortunately, many were eaten by deer. As a result, their display wasn't as magnificent as anticipated. While planting the bulbs, the students discussed the required planting depth and how the bulbs would grow over winter. The classes also encountered other plants, sparking discussions about various bulbs, rhizomes, and tubers that remain dormant underground and blossom in the spring. From February onward, the students observed and monitored the growth stages of the tulip bulbs on a weekly basis. Witnessing the bulbs sprout into lovely flowers was gratifying, despite the challenges posed by the deer!
