# From the Pastor

# Spiritus Est Qui Vivificat

Back in the 1980's when I was a student at Duquesne, the Latin words, "Spiritus est qui vivificat" were plastered all over the place, for this was the motto of the university. Gradually I would come to understand that these words were translated, "It is the Spirit that gives life" and come from Saint Paul's Second Letter to the Corinthians (3:6).

In any event, if we take a quick stroll through Salvation History, we come to see how accurate those words are. For example, in the Book of Genesis, as God commenced His great act of creation, His Spirit hovered over the waters (Gn 1:1-2). Then, in Genesis 2:7, God breaths His Sprit into the newly formed man, and Adam comes to life.

In the New Testament, Jesus is conceived in Mary's womb by the power of the Holy Spirit (Luke 2:35).

Later, following His Baptism in the Jordan River, the Holy Spirit descends upon Jesus and a short time letter His public ministry comes to life.

On Easter Sunday, the Holy Spirit raised Jesus from the dead (Romans 8:11), and that evening He appears to the defeated and demoralized Apostles in the Upper Room and breaths His Spirit on them, and brings them back to life (John 20:22).

As we hear in today's First Reading from Acts 2:1-11, on the day of Pentecost the Holy Spirit descends upon the Apostles who began to preach the Gospel in many different languages. A bit later on in verse 41, we are told that 3000 people embraced the message and were baptized that day, thus making Pentecost the Birthday of the Church.

As we celebrate this great Feast Day, we are reminded that the Holy Spirit is the "life force" behind everything we do. But just as my understanding of Duquesne's Latin motto was slow and gradual, the same can hold true for our comprehension of the Holy Spirit's great importance. Therefore, today we are reminded of the necessity to intentionally

pursue the Holy Spirit and consider His movements in our interior lives and in the life of the Church.





Last weekend I spoke at all my Masses about our parish's upcoming 40 Hours Eucharistic Devotion scheduled for June 1-3. Thanks to everyone who signed up to commit to spending half an hour before the Most Blessed Sacrament during these special days.

By now, all parishioners should have received in the mail a postcard invitation to participate. Please consider signing your family up (including children) for a visit to Saint Anne's church to simply spend time with Jesus to thank Him for spending so much time with us, and to directly entrust to our Eucharistic Lord your most special prayer intentions.

The 40 Hours Devotion will conclude with a Solemn Closing on Monday, June 3 at 6:30pm. Father Joe Freedy will join us as guest preacher. You may remember him as the much-liked preacher of the Saint Anne Novena a couple years ago. Please plan on joining us!




