

From the Pastor



When you walked into church today, you noticed that many of the statues and sacred images have been veiled in purple. This Catholic tradition, sometimes called "Passiontide Veiling", marks a deepening of our Lenten journey as Holy Week approaches and we enter the final phase of this holy season.

The veiling of sacred images find its origins in the ancient Roman liturgy, where the Gospel reading for this Sunday included Jesus' words: "They picked up stones to throw at Him, but Jesus hid Himself and went out of the Temple" (John 8:59).

Therefore, the covering of statues and crosses is a visible reminder of Christ withdrawing from public ministry, intensifying our longing for His presence. It also serves to heighten the dramatic showing of the cross for our veneration on Good Friday.

And finally, by veiling other familiar and favorite images of the saints, the Church encourages us to detach from even good and holy things in order to focus more intently on the greatest mystery of our faith; namely, the Passion, Death and Resurrection of Christ.

Preparing for Holy Week

Years ago, lamenting over the fact that Lent was coming to a close and I really hadn't taken it seriously, my spiritual director advised that I let go of my regrets and put all my energy into observing Holy Week with maximum determination. Knowing me, he said, "Even you Mike can do something for a week!"

I suspect that Lent may have been a mixed bag for many of us, and so we turn our gaze and place our hope in Holy Week, which begins next Sunday. Here are some practical ways to prepare for Palm Sunday and the days that follow:

- 1) Plan Your Schedule Mark your calendar for the key liturgies: Palm Sunday Mass, the Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday and one of the Easter Masses. Prioritize these moments and plan everything else around them!
- **2) Deepen Your Prayer Life** Set aside some extra prayer time in your daily schedule. Maybe wake up 15-20 minutes earlier to read the Gospel accounts of the Lord's Passion (Matthew 26-27; Mark 14-15; Luke 22-23; John 18-19). Pray the Stations of the Cross and the Sorrowful Mysteries of the Holy

Rosary. If you do all five of these, then you pretty much have Holy Week covered!

- 3) **Go to Confession** If you haven't yet gone this Lent, come Monday of Holy Week from 6:00-7:00pm in Saint Anne church. Six priests will be hearing Confessions. If you haven't been to Confession in years, this year is the time to stop making excuses. Confession is one of the seven Sacraments of the Church instituted by Christ for our salvation. They are gifts that Jesus wants us to receive, and it's just rude to reject a gift.
- 4) **Fast and Sacrifice** If you're anything like me, you sometimes play games with the fasting and abstinence requirements of the Church. But, as my spiritual director said to me, "We can do anything for a week!" Consider fasting not only on Good Friday, but several days during Holy Week. And why not fast during Holy Week from social media or unnecessary entertainment or focus more fully on Jesus?

Whatever, we do, let's pray for one another, that Holy Week will make a difference in all of our lives – that we will all receive the grace to leave behind that which separates us from God and one another, and from being the image of Christ we're all called to be.



Day 7, 4/24, Easter Thursday; We will pray the Divine Mercy Novena after the 8:00 AM Mass.



CHRIST'S TWO COMMANDMENTS

How well do we love God and others? Do we love as Christ calls us to? In the Gospel of Matthew, Christ gives us Two Commandments: "He said to him, 'You shall love the Lord, your God, with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind. This is the greatest and the first commandment. The second is like it: You shall love your neighbor as yourself. The whole law and the prophets depend on these two commandments" (Mt 22:37-40).


Not sure what love is? St. Paul describes it for us in his Letter to the Corinthians. Is this how you love God and others? "Love is patient, love is kind. It is not jealous, [love] is not pompous, it is not inflated, it is not rude, it does not seek its own interests, it is not quick tempered, it does not brood over injury, it does not rejoice over wrongdoing but rejoices with the truth. It bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things. Love never fails" (1Cor 13:4-8).


Reconciliation During Lent

One of the ways to keep a Holy Lent is to go to Confession so that your Easter Communion will truly be holy. Make a point to celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation soon. A sincere Confession unites us with Jesus. This act of leaving sin behind

is sometimes not easy. Remorse may bring us to tears of regret when we realize the impact of our hard-hearted actions. Mercifully, forgiveness is assured. Reconciliation is achieved because the Father still welcomes home prodigal sons and daughters. If you haven't been to Confession for a while consider making it part of your seasonal preparation.

Before celebrating the Sacrament of Reconciliation, one should prepare oneself with an examination of conscience, which involves reflecting prayerfully on one's thoughts, words, and deeds in order to identify any sins.

There are various ways to examine your conscience but the one you use should be rooted in Scripture; particularly, the Ten Commandments and Beatitudes.



For Adults

I am the Lord your God: you shall not have strange Gods before me. Have I treated people, events, or things as more important than God?

You shall not take the name of the Lord your God in vain. Have my words, actively or passively, put down God, the Church, or people?

Remember to keep holy the Lord's Day. Do I go to Mass every Sunday (or Saturday Vigil) and on Holy Days of Obligation? Do I avoid, when possible, work that impedes worship to God, joy for the Lord's Day, and proper relaxation of mind and body? Do I look for ways to spend time with family or in service on Sunday? Honor your father and your mother. Do I show my parents due respect? Do I seek to maintain good communication with my parents where possible? Do I criticize them for lacking skills I think they should have?

You shall not kill. Have I harmed another through physical, verbal, or emotional means, including gossip or manipulation of any kind? Have I participated in an abortion, or encouraged someone to do so?

You shall not commit adultery.

Have I respected the physical and sexual dignity of others and myself, and been faithful in marriage? **You shall not steal.** Have I taken or wasted time or resources that belonged to another?

You shall not bear false witness against your neighbor. Have I gossiped, told lies, or embellished stories at the expense of another?

You shall not covet your neighbor's spouse. Have I honored my spouse with my full affection and exclusive love?

You shall not covet your neighbor's goods. Am I content with my own means and needs, or do I compare myself to others unnecessarily?

Have I prayed my morning prayers and night prayers?

Have I prayed with my parents and family?

Have I been moody and rebellious about praying and going to church on Sunday?

Have I asked the Holy Spirit to help me whenever I have been tempted to sin?

Responsibilities to others:

Have I been obedient and respectful to my parents?

Have I lied or been deceitful to them or to others?

Have I been arrogant, stubborn or rebellious?

Have I talked back to parents, teachers or other adults?

Have I pouted and been moody?

Have I been selfish toward my parents, brothers, and sisters, teachers, or my friends and schoolmates?

Have I gotten angry at them? Have I hit anyone?

Have I held grudges or not forgiven others?

Have I treated other children with respect or have I made fun of them and called them names?

Have I used bad language?

Have I stolen anything? Have I returned it?

Have I performed my responsibilities, such as homework and household chores?
